New licensing arrangements for PMSE use of channel 38

We are writing to inform you that from 4 January 2010, you will be able to obtain a licence from JFMG which will allow you to access channel 38 (606-614 MHz) on a shared basis with other PMSE licensees. This increase in available shared frequencies is part of the work that we are doing to help PMSE users migrate from channel 69 to channel 38.

There are some locations where some or all of channel 38 is not available because of the need to protect radio astronomy sites in Cheshire and Cambridgeshire and terrestrial television transmissions in adjacent channels where digital switchover has not taken place. To assist PMSE users, we have arranged for channels 39 and/or 40 to be made available on a shared basis in those locations where channel 38 is not yet fully available. The inclusion of channels 39 and 40 in the UHF Shared UK Wireless Microphone licence will cease when DSO is completed in 2012.

Our records show that you use either channel 39 or 40 on a co-ordinated basis. We would like to confirm for you that these channels will remain available to you on a co-ordinated basis during the temporary period that channels 39 and 40 are available on the new UHF UK Wireless Microphone licence.
